Privacy Policy

Your privacy is important

This privacy policy outlines how Plan2Profit Agri Pty Limited ABN 91 159 180 122, trading as “P2P Agri”, and its related bodies corporate and associates (**we, our or us**) collects, holds, uses and discloses personal information as required by the Australian Privacy Principles (**APPs**) contained in the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth) (**Privacy Act**).

Kinds of personal information we collect

We collect and hold personal information about customers and potential customers, contractors and other people who come into contact with us (**you**).

The kinds of personal information we may collect and hold may include your name, address, phone number, e-mail address, geographic location, financial and other information about you and your business and any other information you provide to us when you use the P2P Agri website or application, including which of our pages or other webpages you have visited.

How we collect personal information

We will generally collect personal information about you directly by way of forms and other documents or information you submit to us (whether in paper or electronic form), correspondence you provide to us and telephone calls or meetings with you.

How we use personal information

We will only use personal information for the following purposes unless otherwise required or permitted by law:

- to provide you with the best possible service in supplying you with our goods and services;
- to answer any questions or inquiries you direct to us;
- to provide you with marketing materials in relation to offers, specials, products and services we have available from time to time;
- for our internal management purposes, to manage our relationship with you to manage the payment and recovery of amounts payable to us by you or an entity related to you (as applicable);
- to, where applicable, aggregate and/or de-identify such information, and otherwise use such information as permitted under our [General Terms and Conditions of Use](#); and
- for other purposes which are reasonably necessary in connection with our normal functions and activities.

If we are unable to collect personal information relating to you, we may be unable to provide you with the goods or services you require or continue our relationship with you.

Disclosure of your personal information

We may disclose personal information to the following kinds of entities for the relevant purposes mentioned above:

- our contractors, consultants, advisers, associates and related entities;

- any industry body, tribunal, court or otherwise in connection with any complaint made by you about us; and
- other entities with your consent or as permitted or required by law.

We may store the kinds of personal information listed above with third party storage providers that are located overseas from time to time. As at the date of this policy, such third party storage providers are located in Australia, although this may change over time. We will endeavour to update this policy as soon as practicable if that is the case, and set out the countries where such data will be stored.

How we hold personal information

We hold personal information in paper form and electronic form. We have in place steps to protect the personal information we hold from misuse, interference and loss and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure. We may use third party data storage providers to store personal information.

It is our policy to destroy all personal information once there is no longer a legal or business need to retain that information. The use of electronic mail is not secure given the nature of such technology. It is possible that e-mail that is transmitted over the internet can be viewed, copied or amended. Accordingly, if you are concerned about the security of any correspondence to our office, you should consider communicating by normal post, over the telephone or by facsimile.

Direct marketing communications

From time to time we may use your personal information to provide you with marketing materials in relation to offers, specials, products and services that we have available. If you would not like to receive direct marketing materials from us you may notify us using the contact details set out below.

Cookies

A cookie is a data file that a website transfers to your computer. This enables the website to track the pages you have visited. A cookie only contains information you supply. It cannot read data on your computer. There are many types of cookies that may be used for different purposes. For example, some cookies help a website to remember information about your visit, like your preferred language and other settings while others may identify which pages are being visited or offer security features. Our website uses cookies. You can set your browser to refuse cookies, however, this may mean you are unable to take full advantage of our website.

Other websites

Other websites, which are not operated by us, are not covered by this policy (even if that website is accessed from a link displayed or posted on our websites). We encourage our users to be aware when they leave our website and to read the privacy statements of each and every website that collects personal information. Please note that we do not accept any responsibility or liability for policies or the use and/or reliance of data appearing on other websites.

How to obtain access to your personal information

You may obtain access to personal information which we hold about you by contacting us using the contact details set out below. When you request copies of your personal information held by us we will endeavour to provide you with such personal information as soon as reasonably practicable.

We may require you to verify your identity and specify what information you require. There may be occasions when access to personal information we hold about you is denied. Such occasions would include where release of the information would have an unreasonable impact on the privacy of others.

Accuracy and completeness of personal information

While we will endeavour to ensure that the personal information collected from you is up to date accurate and complete, we will assume that any personal information provided by you is free from errors and omissions. You may request that we update or vary personal information that we hold about you using the contact details listed below.

How to make a complaint about a breach of your privacy rights by us

If you are of the view we have breached the APPs, the Privacy Act, or any related privacy code in dealing with your personal information, you may make a complaint by writing to us using the contact details below and we will endeavour to respond and provide you with confirmation as to how we propose to deal with the complaint as soon as reasonably practicable.

Anonymity and pseudonyms

We may, from time to time, review and update this privacy policy to take account of new laws and technology, changes to our functions and activities, and to make sure it remains appropriate.
